From Washington

Take I-495 E toward Baltimore/College Park. Merge onto I-95 North via Exit 27, Take Exit 53-395 Baltimore/Inner Harbor. Right onto Pratt Street (pass Harbor Place, Little Italy). Left onto Broadway (approx. 9 blocks to Kennedy Krieger Institute, 707 North Broadway located on the right-hand side of the street on the corner of Monument and Broadway)

From the North

Take I-95 South to Exit 59-Eastern Avenue toward Highland Town. Right onto Broadway (approx. 9 blocks to Kennedy Krieger Institute, 707 North Broadway located on the right-hand side of the street on the corner of Monument and Broadway)

From the East

Take US-50 West. Take Exit 21, I-97 North. Merge onto I-695 W toward Towson. Merge onto Baltimore-Washington Parkway, Rte. 295 North via Exit 7B. Rte. 295 ends at Pratt Street. Right onto Pratt Street (pass Harbor Place, Little Italy).
